NEW BUSINESS

Personnel Policy Amendment

George Huffman addressed Council concerning Sections 5.11 Paid Quarantine Leave Policy and 5.12 Unpaid Quarantine Leave Policy of the City of Archer City Personnel Policy. George stated these sections were added last year due to recommendations by the City Attorneys; however, the sections are no longer required. Billy Burks made the motion to table for further review. Debra Haehn seconded the motion. All members present voted “Aye”.

Personnel Policy Amendment

George Huffman addressed Council concerning Section 3.06 Work Periods of the Archer City Personnel Policy. George recommended the amendment, which states the standard number of required work hours within the work period is forty (40) hours for full time regular non-exempt employees. Leslie Hash made the motion to approve the amendment. Paula Bradley seconded the motion. All members present voted “Aye”.

Resolution 449 4B Archer County Shooting Sports Complex

Kim Whitsitt gave the first reading of a resolution authorizing the expenditure of 4B funds to contribute up to \$15,000.00 to fund improvements at the Archer County Shooting Sports Complex. No action taken.

Nortex Interlocal Contract TXCDBG 2021 2022 Project

Kim Whitsitt addressed Council concerning the termination of the 2021 2022 Interlocal Governmental Cooperation contract for application and administration Services for the Texas Community Development Block Grant program between the City and Nortex Regional Planning Commission. Kim stated Nortex would no longer provide grant services for the CDBG projects due to staff shortages. Leslie Hash made the motion to terminate the contract with Nortex. Billy Burks seconded the motion. All members present voted "Aye".

AMR Proposal for Emergency Medical Services

George Huffman addressed Council and stated AMR had proposed to contract with the City for one year for \$450,000.00. No action taken.

Budget Workshop

Kim Whitsitt reviewed the 2022 2023 budget with Council. No action taken.
