ORDINANCE NO. 316

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ARCHER CITY, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REVISE ARTICLE 1.06 PUBLIC PLACES AND PROPERTY; ESTABLISHING THE SEVERABILITY OF THIS ORDINANCE AND PROVIDING FOR ANY CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARCHER CITY, TEXAS:

ARTICLE I. CODE AMENDED

That the Code of Ordinances be revised in Sec. 1.06.001 City Lake to read as follows:

Sec. 1.06.001 City Lake

- (a) The city hereby adopts the following regulations at the City Lake:
 - (1) Boats shall be used only during daylight hours, and shall not be left on the lake overnight.
 - (2) No motors above 10 H.P. shall be permitted on lake, unless owner has a special permit from the city manager.
 - (3) No person shall swim in or water ski on the lake.
 - (4) Trot lines or throw lines are prohibited and will not be used.
 - (5) In areas of the lake marked "Restricted," fishing will be prohibited.
 - (6) No persons are permitted to fish in the lake without wearing waders or wading boots.
 - (7) The city water superintendent is authorized to enforce all City Lake regulations hereby established.
- (b) Any person, firm or corporation who shall fail to comply with any of the provisions hereof, shall upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine in accordance with the general penalty provision found in Section 1.01.009 of this code.

ARTICLE II. CONFLICTING PROVISIONS

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

ARTICLE III. SEVERABILITY OF ORDINANCE

If any section, subsection, sentence, phrase, or word of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE IV. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after its publication in the Archer County News.
